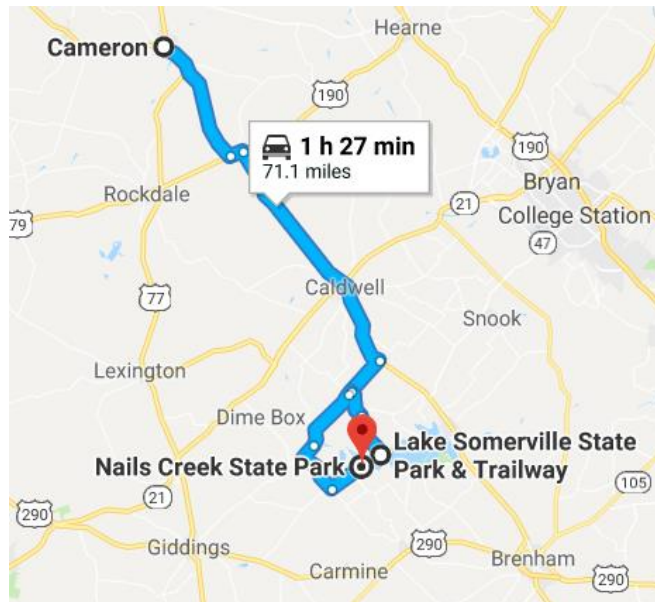


DIRECTIONS



Cameron – Milam Inn & Suites (Budget Host Hotel) – 102 Lafferty Ave, Cameron - Take US-77/190 to Cameron. Hotel is southeast of downtown. After registering, you will drive about 2 miles to the Milam County Courthouse to start the walk.

Cameron to Lake Somerville State Park – Take US-190 south to Milano, jog left to TX-36, then south on TX-36 thru Caldwell to FM-976/132. Right on FM-976 to FM-60, then left on FM-60 to park. Look for state park signs.

Somerville & Ledbetter - Lake Somerville State Park Visitor Center (Birch Creek Unit) – 14222 Park Rd 57, Somerville – 8:00-4:30, closed Thanksgiving & Christmas – Register & walk the Birch Creek Unit in Somerville. Register and then drive 12 miles to the Nails Creek Unit outside of Ledbetter. Ask rangers for directions from Birch Creek to Nails Creek.

Cameron, the county seat of Milam County

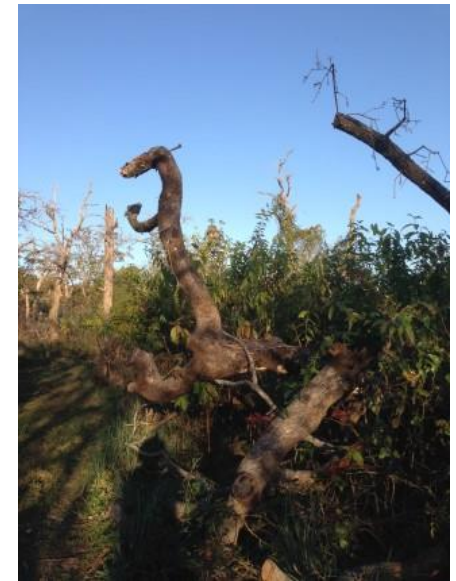
Cameron was named for Ewen Cameron who participated in the Texas Revolution and was a member of the Mier Expedition. Walk passes historic sites, courthouse, old jail, churches, and many turn of the 20th century homes.



Ledbetter - Nails Unit of Lake Somerville State Park

Lake Somerville State Park is divided into 2 units, the Birch Creek Unit on the north shore of the lake in Burleson County and the Nails Unit on the south side in Lee County. Both units offer hiking, biking, equestrian trails and water activities. A 13 mile trail connects the 2 units. Unfortunately, parts of it are closed due to floods in recent years that have taken out bridges.

Walk along the shores of Lake Somerville and thru the forest. Look for birds and deer.



Somerville - Birch Creek Unit of Lake Somerville State Park

Look for Tree-Rex along the trails of the Birch Creek Unit as you walk thru forest along the banks of Lake Somerville. There are lots of wildlife and birds in the park.
